

DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES 2020-2021


- **❖** Department of Chemistry maintained its first position in the final semester UG and PG university examination.

Chemistry association organized CORONAM from 30-08-2021 to 1-09-2021. Many students participated in different types of competitions


