Date:09/06/2022 Title: Oppam Organized by NSS No.of students participated: 90






Date:02/10/2022 – 1/11 /2022 Title: Anti-Drug Campaign Organized by: NSS No of students participated: 100






Date: 31/10/2022 Title: National Unity Day Organized by: NSS No.of students Participated: 50

further reinforces the commitment to national unity and solidarity. Such initiatives contribute to fostering a sense of patriotism, social cohesion, and communal harmony among the participants




Date: 04/03/2023 Title: National Science Day Celebrations Organized by: NSS No.of students participated: 90
